Dwarf Bush Lilacs

A more compact, restrained form, reaching 4-5ft tall and wide. Perfect for foundation plantings or as an informal hedge.

Dwarf & Compact

Re-Blooming Lilacs

Blooms in spring, rests during summer, and re-blooms in fall. Compact, mounded shape growing 4-5ft tall and wide.

VARIETIES

- Bloomerang- Dark Purple

HARDY PERENNIAL

They are a staple garden shrub in northern climates and are very **hardy** in our growing zone.

FRAGRANT

Lilacs evoke nostalgic memories of your grandmother's garden, with sweetly **fragrant** flowers.

Cone-shaped clusters of tiny **flowers** occur in shades of white, purple, pink or blue in Early May
